ALTERNATE MEDICAL CARE

CONSENT ORDER

Claimant filed a petition seeking alternate medical care on August 31, 2022. A telephonic hearing on the petition was scheduled to occur on September 13, 2023, at 8:30 AM.

On the date of hearing, claimant's counsel notified the undersigned of a potential agreement between the parties regarding the requested care. During a conference call with the parties, counsel for Mondelez International and Indemnity Insurance Company of North America notified the undersigned that his clients had agreed to authorize and direct claimant's medical care. The parties agreed that a consent order should be entered regarding the same.

With respect to the specific alternate medical care requested, claimant broadly sought "additional evaluation and treatment." Defendants have agreed to authorize and arrange medical treatment for claimant at Cedar Valley Medical Specialists, P.C. Defendants agree to schedule claimant to be seen at Cedar Valley Medical Specialists, P.C. as soon as possible.

The parties desired that a consent order be entered in this case, in lieu of a hearing. After discussion between the parties and an agreement to provide the requested care, there is no justiciable issue for hearing and determination. Both parties agree that a consent order is appropriate, and a formal hearing is unnecessary to resolve the contested case dispute.

By reaching this agreement and consenting to this order, neither party waives any rights they may have in the future to address medical treatment. Defendants maintain the right to direct medical care in this case.
