Claimant Concepcion Molina appeals from an arbitration decision filed on December 29, 2022. Defendant Wells Enterprises, Inc., self-insured employer, responds to the appeal. The case was heard on August 8, 2022, and it was considered fully submitted in front of the deputy workers' compensation commissioner on September 6, 2022.

In the arbitration decision, the deputy commissioner found claimant failed to carry her burden of proof to establish she sustained a work-related injury as alleged. Because the deputy commissioner found against claimant on the issues of causation and compensability, the deputy commissioner found the other issues raised in this matter are moot. The deputy commissioner ordered the parties to pay their own costs of the arbitration proceeding.

Claimant asserts on appeal that the deputy commissioner erred in finding claimant failed to prove she sustained a work-related injury as alleged. Claimant asserts the deputy commissioner erred in finding the other issues raised in this matter are moot. Claimant asserts the deputy commissioner erred in ordering the parties to pay their own costs of the arbitration proceeding.

Defendant asserts on appeal that the arbitration decision should be affirmed in its entirety.

Those portions of the proposed arbitration decision pertaining to issues not raised on appeal are adopted as a part of this appeal decision.

I have performed a de novo review of the evidentiary record and the detailed arguments of the parties, and I reach the same analysis, findings, and conclusions as those reached by the deputy commissioner.

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Pursuant to Iowa Code sections 17A.5 and 86.24, I affirm and adopt as the final agency decision those portions of the proposed arbitration decision filed on December 29, 2022, which relate to the issues properly raised on intra-agency appeal.

I find the deputy commissioner provided a well-reasoned analysis of all the issues raised in the arbitration proceeding. I affirm the deputy commissioner's findings of fact and conclusions of law pertaining to those issues.

I affirm the deputy commissioner's finding that claimant failed to prove she sustained a work-related injury as alleged. Because I affirm the deputy commissioner's finding against claimant on the issues of causation and compensability, I affirm the deputy commissioner's finding that the other issues raised in this matter are moot. I affirm the deputy commissioner's order that the parties pay their own costs of the arbitration proceeding.

I affirm the deputy commissioner's findings, conclusions and analysis regarding the above-stated issues.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the arbitration decision filed on December 29, 2022, is affirmed in its entirety.

Claimant shall take nothing from these proceedings.

Pursuant to rule 876 IAC 4.33, the parties shall pay their own costs of the arbitration proceeding, and claimant shall pay the costs of the appeal, including the cost of the hearing transcript.

Pursuant to rule 876 IAC 3.1(2), defendant shall file subsequent reports of injury as required by this agency.
