CONSENT ORDER

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Claimant filed an Original Notice and Petition for Alternate Medical Care with this agency on October 7, 2022.

Based on an agreement between the parties, and a proposed consent order, defendant agrees that all outstanding payments to Living Well Home Care have been or are being processed for payment. Defendant also agrees that Broadspire, and/or its designated specialty network provider, will facilitate prompt payment to Living Well Home Care for claimant Caleb Deist's ongoing treatment.


To avoid an unnecessary hearing, and yet protect the interests of their clients, the parties agree to entry of a consent order, requiring defendant to make payments for Mr. Deist's care as described above

This consent order is not intended to reflect findings of fact or conclusions of law relative to this claim. Rather, it is intended to document and enter an order that is consistent with both parties' positions and acceptable to both parties. A formal alternate medical care hearing was not conducted, as all parties consented to entry of this order and waived the formal hearing.

## THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

Pursuant to the agreement of the parties, defendant agrees that all outstanding payments to Living Well Home Care have been or are being processed for payment. Defendant also agrees that Broadspire, and/or its designated specialty network provider, will facilitate prompt payment to Living Well Home Care for Caleb Deist's ongoing treatment. Claimant retains the right to file another petition for alternate medical care regarding this matter if necessary.
