Claimant filed an Original Notice and Petition for Alternate Medical Care with this agency on August 5, 2022. In the Original Notice and Petition for Alternate Medical Care, claimant requested defendants be ordered to authorize claimant's providers in Minnesota to provide care and treatment for histoplasmosis and/or provide care for histoplasmosis within a reasonable distance of claimant's Minnesota residence.

Based on emails with counsel for both parties, and a proposed consent order, defendants agree to authorize and provide claimant treatment and care for histoplasmosis near his residence in Minnesota.

To avoid an unnecessary hearing, and yet protect the interests of their clients, the parties agree to entry of a consent order, requiring defendants to authorize and provide claimant treatment and care for histoplasmosis near his residence in Minnesota.

This consent order is not intended to reflect findings of fact or conclusions of law relative to this claim. Rather, it is intended to document and enter an order that is consistent with both parties' positions and acceptable to both parties. A formal alternate medical care hearing was not conducted, as all parties consented to entry of this order and waived the formal hearing.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

Pursuant to the agreement of the parties prior to the scheduled August 18, 2022, alternate medical care hearing, defendants shall authorize and provide claimant treatment and care for histoplasmosis near his residence in Minnesota. Claimant

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retains the right to file another petition for alternate medical care regarding this matter if necessary.
