CONSENT ORDER

This is a contested case concerning alternate medical care, proceeding under Iowa Code chapters 85 and 17A. The expedited procedure of rule 876 IAC 4.48 is invoked by claimant, Dale Hayes. The alternate medical care claim was scheduled for telephone hearing on October 25, 2021, at 8:30 a.m.

Prior to the commencement of the hearing, on October 25, 2021, the parties and the undersigned discussed the entry of a consent order in this matter. Counsel for the defendants indicated that the defendants agreed to authorize care as noted in the petition of: physical therapy, aqua therapy, and referral to a pain psychologist per the recommendations of Dr. Wickle. The defendants also agreed to continued authorization of treatment with Dr. Miller for pain management. The defendants agreed that this care is authorized.

The parties proposed that the undersigned issue this consent order in lieu of a formal hearing. All parties consented to the entry of a consent order verbally on October 25, 2021; thus no alternate medical care hearing was necessary.


## ORDER
