Claimant Ferlin McAlister appeals from an arbitration decision filed on May 26, 2016. Defendants Jacobson Transportation Co., Inc., employer, and its insurer, Zurich American Insurance Co., respond to the appeal. The case was heard on February 4, 2016, and it was considered fully submitted in front of the deputy workers' compensation commissioner on February 29, 2016.

The deputy commissioner found claimant failed to carry his burden of proof that he sustained an injury which arose out of and in the course of his employment with defendant-employer on August 31, 2013, as alleged. Because the deputy commissioner found claimant failed to carry his burden of proof on the issues of causation and compensability regarding claimant's alleged injury, the deputy commissioner found claimant failed to prove entitlement to temporary disability benefits, permanent disability benefits and medical benefits. Because the deputy commissioner found claimant failed to carry his burden of proof on the issues of causation and compensability, the deputy commissioner found defendants' lowa Code section 85.23 90-day notice defense is moot. The deputy commissioner ordered the parties to pay their own costs of the arbitration proceeding.

Claimant asserts on appeal that the deputy commissioner erred in finding claimant failed to carry his burden of proof that he sustained a work-related injury on August 31, 2013, as alleged. Claimant asserts the deputy commissioner erred in finding claimant failed to prove entitlement to temporary disability benefits, permanent total disability benefits and medical benefits.

Defendants assert on appeal that the arbitration decision should be affirmed in its entirety.

Those portions of the proposed agency decision pertaining to issues not raised on appeal are adopted as a part of this appeal decision.

I have performed a de novo review of the evidentiary record and the detailed arguments of the parties and I reach the same analysis, findings, and conclusions as those reached by the deputy commissioner.

Pursuant to Iowa Code sections 17A.5 and 86.24, I affirm and adopt as the final agency decision those portions of the proposed arbitration decision filed on May 26, 2016, which relate to the issues properly raised on intra-agency appeal.

I find the deputy commissioner provided a well-reasoned analysis of all the issues raised in the arbitration proceeding. I affirm the deputy commissioner's findings of fact and conclusions of law pertaining to those issues. I affirm the deputy commissioner's finding that claimant failed to carry his burden of proof that he sustained a work-related injury on August 31, 2013, as alleged. I affirm the deputy commissioner's finding that claimant failed to prove entitlement to temporary disability benefits, permanent disability benefits and medical benefits. I affirm the deputy commissioner's finding that defendants' lowa Code section 85.23 90-day notice defense is moot. I affirm the deputy commissioner's order that the parties pay their own costs of the arbitration proceeding. I affirm the deputy commissioner's findings, conclusions and analysis regarding the above issues.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the arbitration decision filed on May 26, 2016, is affirmed in its entirety.

Claimant shall taking nothing from these proceedings.

Pursuant to rule 876 IAC 4.33, the parties shall pay their own costs of the arbitration proceeding, and claimant shall pay the costs of the appeal, including the cost of the hearing transcript.
